ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

Promoting health and well-being is one of the 17 Global Goals that make-up the *2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development*. An integrated approach is crucial for making progress across these goals. "One Health" is a collaborative, multi-sectoral and trans-disciplinary approach that reinforces the ambitions towards Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and helps accelerate progress towards their achievement. One health approach establishes the link between humans, animals and the environment in a collaborative approach to tackle the health problems and strive to achieve optimal health outcomes at local, regional, national and global levels by recognizing the interconnection between people, animals, plants and their shared environment.

Effective implementation of "One Health" programs can only be successful by embedding together political commitment, policy formulation, sustainable financing, program development, knowledge sharing, institutional collaboration, capacity enhancement, engagement of civil society and active participation of the communities. This can be made possible by discussing the perceptions, scope, opportunities and challenges being encountered in ensuring healthy lives and promoting well-being for all (SDG-3).

In order to deliberate on the above, the Centre for Science & Technology of the Non-Aligned and Other Developing Countries (NAM S&T Centre), New Delhi, in partnership with the Chinhoyi University of Technology (CUT), Chinhoyi, Zimbabwe, announces the organization of an International Conference on **"Achieving One Health: Perceptions, Scope, Opportunities and Challenges in the Developing World"** during **November 28-29, 2024** in Chinhoyi, Zimbabwe.

The Conference will be hosted and organized by the Chinhoyi University of Technology (CUT).

OBJECTIVES

The Conference will be organized with the following objectives:

- Achieve universal health coverage, including financial risk protection, access to quality essential healthcare services and access to safe, effective, quality and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all;
- Address the role of "One Health" in detecting, preventing and responding to infectious disease outbreaks and pandemics, as well as addressing anti-microbial resistance and other global health challenges in developing countries;
- Support research, development and universal access to affordable vaccines and medicines;
- Assess the impacts of climate change on the health and the need for "One Health" approach to address these challenges, including the spread of disease vectors, food security and ecosystem disruption;
- Promote the role of indigenous knowledge in "One Health" approach;
- Fight communicable diseases;
- Increase health financing and support the health workforce in developing countries;
- Substantially reduce the number of deaths and illnesses from hazardous chemicals and air, water and soil pollution and contamination - Environmental Health;

- Promote standardization of ethno-medicines, use of natural products in health, immunization and vaccine development, genomic and precision medicine;
- Improve livestock health and production in the developing world;
- Preparing a Comprehensive Roadmap to achieve “One Health” in the Global South.

SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS

Scientists and experts desirous of participating in the Conference from NAM S&T Members and other Developing Countries, except those from Zimbabwe, are required to submit their application electronically to Dr. Amitava Bandopadhyay, Director General, NAM S&T Centre, New Delhi at namstcentre@gmail.com as early as possible but latest by **October 21, 2024 [Monday]**.

The following documents must be submitted as e-mail attachments:

- a) Filled in Application Form (enclosed along with the announcement brochure).
- b) A Write-up (a short paragraph; MS Word only) on how the applicant qualifies to participate in the Conference.
- c) A Short Biography (to be written in third person in about 200-250 words; MS Word only) highlighting the current engagement, area of expertise, major achievements, academic qualification and professional experience, etc. as succinctly as possible.
- d) An Extended Abstract (about 250-300 words; MS Word only) of the Paper that would be presented at the Conference.
- e) A Scan Copy of the relevant pages of a valid Passport.

Note: The documents (b), (c) and (d) above must be in MS-WORD FORMAT only; PDF or image files will not be accepted. Hard copies of the Application Form and the above attachments are **NOT REQUIRED** to be submitted.

PRESENTATION OF PAPERS

Participants are expected to present a Country Status Report and/or a research/scientific paper on any of the themes appropriate to the Conference.

PUBLICATION OF PAPERS

A publication edited by one or more international experts and based on the papers presented by the participants during the Conference and also containing papers contributed by other eminent experts in the field will be brought out in the form of a book as a follow-up of the Conference. Therefore, all participants are requested to submit the manuscripts of their full papers in MS-Word format only well in advance, but latest by **October 31, 2024 [Thursday]**.

A copy of the "Author's Guidelines" is also **attached**. The book will be published by a reputed International Publishing House.

SELECTION OF APPLICANTS

Selection of applicants will be made based on their academic and professional backgrounds. Successful applicants will be electronically informed about their selection and other important details.

Details about the virtual platform will be provided well within the time after the selection procedure is completed. Other details and terms and conditions of participation will be given to the individual candidates on receipt of their applications.

Following will be applicable to Participants attending the Conference in Physical Mode:

LOCAL HOSPITALITY AND TRAVEL

Local hospitality in Zimbabwe including accommodation, meals and local transport (airport transfers) for the foreign participants sponsored by the NAM S&T Centre will be provided from 27 November 2024 [Noon] - 30 November 2024 [Noon] (i.e. from one day before the commencement to one day after the completion of the Conference). The participants are requested to book their flights accordingly; otherwise, they will have to make their own arrangements to stay beyond these indicated dates.

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR TRAVEL

The financial terms and arrangements for international travel of foreign participants will be conveyed to individual applicants on receipt of their Application Form along with other required documents.

ENTRY FORMALITIES AND IMMIGRATION

Participants of the Conference must be in possession of a current passport or any other internationally recognized travel document, which must have a period of validity of at least six months beyond the period of stay in Zimbabwe and must be endorsed for travel to Zimbabwe.

Participants should have a valid visa for entry into Zimbabwe. The Zimbabwe diplomatic mission located in the country of the participant should be approached for obtaining an entry visa. For a large number of countries, however, visa on arrival facility is available. If required, the organizers will facilitate the issuance of visa by providing the participants with an official letter of invitation.

Note: The governments/institutions of the selected participants will be required to bear the following costs:

- All expenses in the home country incidental to travel abroad, including expenditure for passport, required medical examinations, vaccination and miscellaneous expenses such as internal travel to the airport of departure in the home country.
- Salary and other related allowances for the participants during the period of the Conference.
- Cost of medical insurance to cover the period of participation in the Conference.

The NAM S&T Centre and the organizers of this Conference will not assume responsibility for the following expenditure in connection with the participant's attendance in the Conference:

- Expenses incurred with respect to any insurance, medical bills or hospitalization fees.
- Compensation in the event of death, disability or illness of participant.
- Loss of personal belongings or compensation for damage caused to them by climatic or other conditions.
- Other costs, including visa fee, airport taxes and excess baggage fee, etc.

OTHER USEFUL INFORMATION -

- In November, Chinhoyi generally has very high temperatures and moderate rainfall. Daytime temperatures hover around 30°C, while nights can cool down to about 20°C.
- Zimbabwe Standard Time is +02 hours ahead of GMT.
- Zimbabwe has a multicurrency System with the nation's local currency, Zimbabwe Gold Currency (Zig) and US dollar dominating.

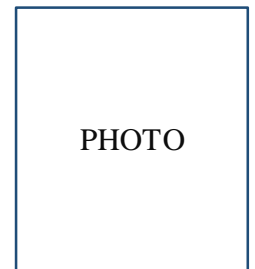
